## Video Transcript

Narrator: Quality early care and education builds a strong foundation for your child's future.

Narrator: That's why it's so important to look for key elements of quality when choosing a child care program.

Narrator: First, check if the program is licensed by the Maryland State Department of Education, Office of Child Care and also participating in Maryland EXCELS.

Narrator: Maryland EXCELS programs go above and beyond basic safety requirements by showing their commitment to providing high-quality care.

Narrator: Look for our quality rating badges when you visit a program to see if it's part of Maryland EXCELS.

1. Play

Narrator: When visiting a potential child care program you're interested in, be on the lookout for these important things.

Narrator: See if the children and staff are happy and how teachers engage with the children.

Narrator: Ask if the program has a philosophy or mission statement and if they follow a daily schedule.

Narrator: Find out if the program uses a developmentally and age-appropriate curriculum.

Narrator: Make sure the program reflects and respects your culture, language, and beliefs.

Narrator: Structured lessons are important, but play is a vital part of development, too! Check if children have daily opportunities to play in indoor and outdoor spaces that are clean, organized and safe.
