Urceal Cook: I would recommend that every licensed child care program participate in Maryland EXCELS. However, if a child care program provides care for families who use Child Care Scholarship, they must enroll in Maryland EXCELS.

Annie Reyes: My Child Care Resource Center assisted me in submitting my application. I brought my laptop and applied right there during a class.

Provider Sonya Odum: I thought it was very easy to register and participate in Maryland EXCELS. It took less than ten minutes! All you need to get started is a Lead Contact and your program's license or School ID number to complete the online application.
